- display posters and banners that promote your values in our school.
- provide awards and recognition for students who actively demonstrate the values.
- discuss our values with students in the classroom, meetings, and assemblies.

MISSION Mornington SDS's mission is to provide students with the best possible foundation in life through a well-rounded education.

OBJECTIVE Our school's objectives are considered as part of the 4 yearly strategic planning process and reflected in the goals listed in our current School Strategic Plan (SSP). We also develop an Annual Implementation Plan to operationalise the goals and key improvement strategies contained in our SSP.

VALUES Mornington SDS values are.

Students, staff, and members of our school community are encouraged to live and demonstrate our core values of.

Mornington SDS's values are respect, kindness, and excellence.

We respect ourselves, our school, each another, and the environment and understand that our attitudes and behaviours have an impact on the people around us.

We model and demonstrate kindness and take every opportunity to help others that may be in need.

We strive for excellence, which means trying our hardest and doing our best.

BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS Mornington SDS acknowledges that the behaviour of staff, parents, carers, and students has an impact on our school community and culture.

Staff have a range of expectations around behaviour and must follow our school and Department policies and the Victorian Public Service Code of Conduct and Values. Teaching staff also adhere to the Victorian Teaching Profession Code of Conduct.

Students are supported by school staff to meet expected standards of behaviour as outlined in our Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy, Inclusion and Diversity Policy, Bullying Prevention Policy

Information about the expectations on parents and carers to ensure schools remain respectful and inclusive places is outlined in the Department's Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy and our Respect for School Staff Policy.

As principals and school leaders, we will:

- model positive behaviour and effective leadership.
- communicate politely and respectfully with all members of the school community.
- work collaboratively to create a school environment where respectful and safe behaviour is expected of everyone.
- ensure all parents/carers are aware of the expectations outlined in the Department's Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy
- behave in a manner consistent with the standards of our profession and meet core responsibilities to provide safe and inclusive environments.
- plan, implement and review our work to ensure the care, safety, security, and general wellbeing of all students at school.
- identify and support students who are or may be at risk.
- do our best to ensure every child achieves their personal and learning potential.
- work with parents to understand their child's needs and, where necessary, adapt the learning environment accordingly.
- respond appropriately when safe and inclusive behaviour is not demonstrated and implement appropriate interventions and sanctions when required.
- inform parents of the school's communication and complaints procedures
- ask any person who is acting in an offensive, intimidating or otherwise inappropriate way to leave the school grounds.

As teachers and non-teaching school staff, we will:

- model positive behaviour to students consistent with the standards of our profession.
- communicate politely and respectfully with all members of the school community.
- proactively engage with parents about student outcomes
- work with parents to understand the needs of each student and, where necessary, adapt the learning environment accordingly.
- work collaboratively with parents to improve learning and wellbeing outcomes for students with additional needs.
- communicate with the principal and school leaders in the event we anticipate or face any tension or challenging behaviours from parents.
- treat all members of the school community with respect.

As parents and carers, we will:

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• Scommunicate politically and respectfully with all members of the school community, 4 fin 66 210 461 357 line with the Department's Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy.

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- ensure our child attends school on time, every day the school is open for instruction.
- take an interest in our child's school and learning.
- work with the school to achieve the best outcomes for our child.
- communicate constructively with the school and use expected processes and protocols when raising concerns.
- support school staff to maintain a safe learning environment for all students.
- follow the school's processes for communication with staff and making complaints.
- treat all school leaders, staff, students, and other members of the school community with respect.

As students, we will:

- model positive behaviour to other students.
- communicate politely and respectfully with all members of the school community.
- comply with and model school values.
- behave in a safe and responsible manner.
- respect ourselves, other members of the school community and the school environment.
- actively participate in school
- not disrupt the learning of others and make the most of our educational opportunities.

As community members, we will:

- model positive behaviour to the school community.
- treat other members of the school community with respect.
- support school staff to maintain a safe and inclusive learning environment for all students.
- utilise the school's processes for communication with staff and submitting complaints.

UNREASONABLE BEHAVIOURS

Schools are not public places, and the principal has the right to permit or deny entry to school grounds (for more information, see our *Visitors Policy*).

Unreasonable behaviour that is demonstrated by school staff, parents, carers, students, or members of our school community will not be tolerated at school, or during school activities.

Unreasonable behaviour includes:

- being violent or threatening violence of any kind, including physically intimidating behaviour such as aggressive hand gestures or invading another person's personal space
- speaking or behaving in a rude, aggressive, or threatening way, either in person, via email, social media, or over the telephone
- sending demanding, rude, confronting, or threatening letters, emails or text messages

- discriminatory or derogatory comments
- the use of social media or public forums to make inappropriate or threatening remarks about the school, staff, or students.

Harassment, bullying, violence, aggression, threatening behaviour, and unlawful discrimination are unacceptable and will not be tolerated at our school.

Unreasonable behaviour and/or failure to uphold the principles of this *Statement of Values and School Philosophy* may lead to further investigation and the implementation of appropriate consequences by the principal.

At the Principal's discretion, unreasonable behaviour may be managed by:

- requesting that the parties attend a mediation or counselling sessions.
- implementing specific communication protocols
- written warnings.
- conditions of entry to school grounds or school activities
- exclusion from school grounds or attendance at school activities
- reports to Victoria Police
- legal action.

Inappropriate student behaviour will be managed in according with our school's *Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy* and *Bullying Prevention Policy*.

Our Statement of Values and School Philosophy ensures that everyone in our school community will be treated with fairness and respect. In turn, we will strive to create a school that is inclusive and safe, where everyone is empowered to participate and learn.
